HOW THE IDBF BEGAN

BY ROBERT WILSON, IDBF FOUNDING PRESIDENT

For 2,400 years dragon boat racing had been an annual festival, not a recognised sport.

Hong Kong changed that and the story of the founding of the IDBF began in 1976, in the Chinese 'Year of the Dragon', when John Pain, Executive Director of the Hong Kong Tourist Association, invited a crew from Nagasaki, Japan to compete against nine fishermen's crews during the annual dragon boat festival in Shau Kei Wan, a small fishing port on the eastern side of Hong Kong Island.

The object was to promote Hong Kong as a tourist destination during the summer low season.

Nagasaki returned in 1977, joined by a team from Penang.

In 1978 the races moved to the Central Harbour's East Tsim Sha Tsui waterfront, with overseas entries from Nagasaki, Penang and Singapore.

The races were being televised live across Asia but after a collision in the Grand Final a brawl erupted between a Hong Kong crew from Saikung and Nagasaki, the previous year's winner and favourites to win again, and then between the Saikung crew and the winning Hong Kong crew from Aberdeen. This wasn't the kind of publicity wanted by the Tourist Association.

The races had been managed by one of Hong Kong's fishermen's associations, but a few days earlier the Hong Kong Amateur Rowing Association (HKARA) had been formed to develop rowing. Bob Wilson was its President and, seeing an opportunity to establish the HKARA's credentials as an organiser of water sport, he approached the Tourist Association.

His offer of help was accepted and for the next 18 years the Rowing Association managed the Hong Kong races.

The HKARA took the view that the races should be organized like a serious sport so they drafted rules of racing and trained dragon boat race officials. They ensured that the boats started level and installed photo-finish equipment. The full length of the waterfront promenade was used and when the finish line was

set the course distance was found to be 640 metres. This was longer than usual for dragon boat races, but being more challenging it helped establish the Hong Kong races as something special.

In 1978 Singapore established its own international races, followed in 1979 by Penang and these three regattas, together with Macau, made for an attractive circuit for visiting crews.

Invitations to compete were issued in the Tourist Association's target countries around the world and in 1980 three dragon boats were sent to London to race on the Thames in a Hong Kong promotional festival.

The HKARA officials took the view that race management and officiating had to be ahead of the standard of the competing crews. Competitors responded to this and there were very few protests.

Wilson, as Race Controller, briefed the overseas crew representatives before the races and met with them afterwards to discuss how the races had gone and to hear any suggestions for improvement.

In 1995 some 4,300 competitors took part and the Hong Kong races had become the world's biggest international dragon boat regatta and the de facto world club championship. By promoting the races the Tourist Association had stimulated the formation of more than a hundred dragon boat clubs around the world.

HOW THE IDBF BEGAN

During the 1980s a number of national dragon boat associations had been formed and on June 4, 1990 Wilson chaired a conference of 35 dragon boat race organisers and team representatives from 15 countries. The state of dragon boat racing in each country was reported and the need for an international federation was agreed. Wilson summarized the proposed purposes of the federation and said that a steering committee should be set up to prepare a draft constitution and that a foundation meeting should be convened within 12 months. A seven member steering group was then appointed under his chairmanship.

In the following months Wilson drafted proposed statutes and on June 24, 1991 he chaired the meeting in Hong Kong where twelve national associations founded the International Dragon Boat Federation, adopted its first statutes and elected its first Council members. Wilson became President, Mike Haslam, from the UK, became Secretary-General and Lu Jin-dong, from China, became Honorary President.

The Tourist Association offered secretarial support and the IDBF became the first and only international sports federation to be headquartered in Hong Kong.

Wilson served as President until 1994 then stepped down because, he said, the role really needed someone who could devote more time and do more travelling than he could, given his other sports commitments in Hong Kong. He emphasized that a lot of the credit for making dragon boat racing into a successful sport should go to his HKARA colleagues and to people at the Hong Kong Tourist Association who first got the ball rolling and then wholeheartedly supported the development of the sport.


This paradragon club was formed in late 2016 with a mission to:

Tentative schedule

The United States Dragon Boat Federation (USDBF) and the International Dragon Boat Federation (IDBF), cordially invite Club Crews from around the world to participate in the Club Crew World Championships. (CCWC).

Date

The 13th IDBF Club Crew World Dragon Boat Racing Championships will be held in Sarasota, Florida, USA. Team arrival and training will be held Thursday, July 14th to Sunday, July 17th. Competition will be held from Monday, July 18 to Sunday, July 24, 2022.

Regatta course

- Address: 5851 Nathan Benderson Circle, Sarasota, Florida 34235 Width: 130 meters
- Depth: 3.5 meters minimum
- Racing Lanes: 9 lanes each of 13.5 meters wide
- Docks: multiple and will be positioned for greatest flexibility and ease of loading
- Water Quality: healthy quality and tested monthly; the lake is part of an overall water system which feeds into the water supply for the City of Bradenton
- Avg Temp: July average temperatures are a low of 73° F (23° C) and a high of 93° F (34° C)

It is expected that most Teams will arrive during the period of July 14th – 17th 2022. Crews are advised to arrive in Sarasota no later than Sunday, July 17th.
